- Hand in your Worksheet for marking and be sure to ask your teacher for feedback before your test.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 1 Test.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with formatting and writing personal and business letters.

- Complete all the work on the worksheet, and when you are satisfied, hand it in for marking. Be sure to learn the block format for business letters as explained in the worksheet. It is the easiest format to remember (and the one most widely used in business today).
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 2 Test.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with creating essay outlines.

- The elements of a basic five-paragraph essay.
- Planning an essay so it suits a particular audience or purpose.
- Using an outline to help you write an essay.

- This Unit uses the Unit 03 Worksheet. Ask your teacher for it.
- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Read pp. 150-159 in the textbook.
- Complete all the work on the worksheet, and when you are satisfied, hand it in for marking.
- There is **NO** Unit 3 Test. The work you do on the worksheet counts as your mark for this unit.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with turning an essay outline into a finished basic five-paragraph essay.

Unit Objectives:

By the end of this unit you should be able to:

• Write a proper basic five-paragraph essay from an outline you have prepared.

- This Unit uses the **Unit 04 Worksheet.** Ask your teacher for it.
- This unit uses the textbook *Reading and Writing for Success*.
- Re-read pp.158-159 in the textbook.
- Choose an essay outline you prepared in Unit 3 and write a first draft of your five-paragraph essay. Hand this in so your teacher can give you feedback on your work. Do not be tempted to have AI help you write your essay! Your teacher wants to read your words, not those of a machine.
- Once you have received feedback on your first draft, edit and re-write your essay. Your final draft should be typed, and double-spaced.
- Be sure to use the checklist from the Unit 4 Test before stapling it to the front of your essay and handing it in for marking.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with consuming and thinking critically about film media as a story.

Unit Objectives:

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with:

- the elements of a short story.
- identifying story elements in film.
- thinking about the choices storytellers make to have specific impacts.

- This Unit uses the **Unit 05 Worksheet.** Ask your teacher for it.
- Complete all the work on the worksheet, and when you are satisfied, hand it in for marking.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for the Unit 5 Test. You will be required to view a television episode
 and identify story elements and their effects.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skills with consuming and thinking critically about poetry and music.

Unit Objectives:

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with:

- Understanding poetry.
- Identifying elements of poetry in poems and songs.
- Thinking about why poets and songwriters make the choices they do.
- Responding personally to poetry/music.

- This Unit uses the Unit 06 Worksheet. Ask your teacher for it.
- Choose two songs or poems from the suggested list or find appropriate alternatives with the support of your teacher, and engage deeply with these texts by answering the questions on the worksheet.
- Hand your worksheet in for assessment and feedback from your teacher.
- When you are ready, ask your teacher for your "test"/final project for this unit and follow the directions. You may refer to your worksheet to help create your final project for this unit.

The goal of this unit is to increase your skill with reading and thinking crucially about novels.

Unit Objectives:

While completing this unit you will investigate the following topics and practice working with:

- reading a work of fiction.
- thinking critically about what you have read.
- connecting your reading to bigger ideas in your life and the world around you.

- This Unit uses the **Unit 07 Worksheet.** Ask your teacher for it.
- Read the novel *Dreaming in Color* by Melanie Florence (you may also listen to the audiobook or use the EPUB version with full accessibility features).
- Answer the questions on the worksheet while reading the novel. Once you are happy with your answers, hand the completed worksheet in for marking.
- There is NO Unit 7 Test. The work you do on the worksheet counts as your only mark for this unit.

The goal of this unit is to reflect on all your learning in this course, and to use it to tell the story of your life in a purposefully selected medium of your choosing.

While completing this unit you will review and use the learning you have done in this course to:

- Reflect on your life and personal identity.
- Create something new to communicate what is important to you, about you.
